This week's "historical interest" article. **Christ Church Windermere (Anglican)**

Before the construction of Christ Church, Reverend Charles Mockridge, rector of Christ Cathedral in Hamilton, conducted services on his front porch at what is now known as Mockridge Hall (located



adjacent to the church on Golf Avenue Road) beginning in 1894. Rev. Charles Mockridge, bought the land from the Aitken family for \$25. The builder was Charles Cox of Bracebridge, who also built summer homes for Windermere families, Osler and Mockridge.

Construction of the church started in 1900, by Mockridge and

his sons, It was completed in 1904. The church is seasonal with Sunday services conducted in the church in the summer and winter services being held in Mockkridge Hall to alleviate the stress of temperature changes on the church structure. The church



suffered in the 1960's but the Osler, Mockridge and Skinner families helped to revive it. It features wood decorated interior, with pyrography designs, original working organ and stained glass windows. It is a vernacular wood frame construction with Victorian and Gothic Revival influences. It did not have electricity until 1950.
