## This week's "Historical Interest" Article "RUSH" at Windermere House

A more recent bit of Windermere History Submitted by Russ Boychuk

Over the last 155 seasons Windermere House has hosted many renowned musical guests. In March of 1982 the band RUSH came up in the dead of winter to write, rehearse and record songs for their Platinum selling album "Signals". Geddy Lee, Neal Peart and Alex Lifeson stayed for the month of March in the old Settler's Bay units where the Fractionals now stand.

"It was a very cold, snowy winter. The snow was piled up everywhere and we ended up staying in this deserted summer lodge." Alex told Prog Magazine. "The place was completely empty – it was like *The Shining*,"

The Grange, the stone barn now staff housing, had a local rehearsal and recording studio on the first floor at the time. "There was a big venue and we locked ourselves in there for a month or so and rehearsed and finished the songs for the album."

Alex and Geddy played in the Grange during the day as Neal would spend hours by the fireplace in Settlers Bay writing the music. In the evening all 3 would put it together in the Grange.

"The strength of those songs and Alex starting his fascination with remote control airplanes" Geddy told Cygnus Mag. "Those are my enduring memories of the cottage. As soon as we got a break from writing, he would he would go out and try to fly these planes. And of course they'd eventually get lost and we would have to send out a search party for the plane!"

Over the last 40 years on our countless walks thru the nearby woods, I still keep my eye out for any of Alex's lost planes.
