Dear Terry.

I hope this letter finds you in the embrace of gratitude and admiration that we, your admirers, hold for you. My name is Bev Longhurst, a mother and a witness to the incredible impact your Marathon of Hope has had on countless lives, including mine. As a mother, I have experienced firsthand the heart-wrenching journey of watching a loved one battle cancer. My daughter, Jennifer Jackson, was diagnosed with cancer as a young adult at university, a diagnosis that shattered our world and filled our days with fear and uncertainty. It was during this trying time, I discovered your story a tale of unwavering determination and an unbreakable spirit. Your selfless journey across Canada, despite the challenges posed by your prosthetic leg and the weight of your own battle with cancer, ignited a spark within me. Your bravery, resilience and refusal to succumb to despair touched my soul and transformed my perspective on life's adversities.

In 2000, driven by the inspiration your story had instilled in me, I took the leap to organize a Terry Fox Run in our community of Windermere. It was a small initiative at first, but with the support of our dedicated volunteers, compassionate businesses and the wholehearted participation of our community, it grew beyond our wildest dreams.

Each year, on the second Sunday after Labour Day, our community gathers in the spirit of hope and unity, lacing up our shoes and taking to the streets.

The Windermere Terry Fox Run symbolizes resilience, love and a shared commitment to eradicating cancer. Over the years, with the tireless dedication of our volunteers and the unwavering support of our community, we have raised more than \$500,000 toward cancer research — a testament to the incredible power of collective effort and the legacy you left behind.

Terry, your legacy lives on through the countless lives you continue to touch. Your determination to make a difference, to create a world where cancer is nothing more than a memory, is a beacon of light guiding us through our darkest moments. Your Marathon of Hope was not only a physical journey across our vast nation, but a spiritual journey that touched hearts and united communities.

From the depths of my heart, I want to express my deepest gratitude for the immeasurable difference you have made in our lives. Your legacy lives on, not only through the funds we raise, but through the connections we forge, the stories we share and the determination

that fuels us each day.
