This week's "historical interest" article.



The Old Post Office and General Store

The first store in Windermere, was constructed in 1896, by Perry Prosser. It operated as a general store and also a residence into the late 20th C. In 1912, William Aitken purchased the property and moved his telegraph and post office to the store. Also on the property are a large ice house (one of the last cold storage buildings in Muskoka), a small dairy and small stone building for storing flammables. The stone building is constructed of local field stone with timber gable. The dairy is no longer standing but ruins can be seen adjacent to the general store. The structure was abandoned, and afterwards purchased by architect Catherine Nasmith, and noted urban designer/landscape architect, Robert Allsopp, rehabilitated for use as office space and residence. The former Windermere Post Office and General Store was the first general store in Windermere and the first location to sell gasoline after the popularization of the automobile (the gas pumps were later removed). Adjacent to the property is the Benjamin Taylor cottage, constructed between 1911 and 1914 and occupied by early settlers.

This building was designated under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act in 2019. It played a role in the development of Windermere, its relationship to Windermere House, for its connection to the village's early families, and for its contribution to the streetscape of the early period of tourist and cottage development.
