A mystery to solve....what publication did this Historical Note #24 - attached below - come from? We will publish the answer (if we get one) in next week's Gazette! Historical Note #24 June 18, 2004
With today's means of instant global communication, it is easy to forget that we have not always had such convenience. As recently as 1960, Windermere had a very rudimentary telephone service. Not every home had a telephone of any kind. Summer residents of clergy cottage, for instance, had to walk down to The Baldwins Resort, or over to the general store, and make calls on a pay phone. If important news should come from far away, a staff member from The Baldwins would run up the hill with the message.


Those phones that did exist were almost always party lines. To place a call, one would turn a crank. A friendly member of the Beavan family, or the Taylor family would then make the right connections. One would know to answer the phone when the correct combination of long and short rings would sound. When you received a call, there was a good chance that several interested neighbours would listen as well.

Sometimes, to be heard, you would have to shout so loudly into the mouthpiece, that one might wonder if the telephone was even needed.

The postmaster, Ed Paulette, was also a telegraph operator. The telegraph was indeed the means of choice for most long distance communication. If you wanted to inform your distant relative of the birth of a child, for instance, you would simply take your message to Ed. He would translate it into the appropriate dots and dashes, and your relative would receive it far away. It was a very reliable service.

In all of human history, there is probably no field of technology that has evolved so rapidly as that of rapid communication.
