- Promoting eco-friendly practices shoreline cleanups & native planting
- Addressing safety concerns speeding and seasonal traffic issues.
- Encouraging year-round businesses to support both locals and visitors

Celebrating Culture, Heritage & Traditions

- Organizing seasonal festivals, art walks, or heritage days


